What is Teen Dating Violence?

- Physical—Victim is pinched, hit, shoved, slapped, punched, or kicked. Damaging property like computers and cell phones.
- Psychological/Emotional—Threatening a partner or harming his or her sense of self-worth for example name calling, shaming, bullying, embarrassing on purpose, or keeping him/her away from friends and family.
- Sexual—Forcing a partner to engage in a sex act when he or she does not or cannot consent. This can be physical or nonphysical, like threatening to spread rumors if a partner refuses to have sex.
- Stalking—A pattern of harassing or threatening acts in person, on social media, or through a 3rd party.

Effects of Dating Violence?

Victims of Teen Dating Violence can suffer from:

- Depression and suicidal thoughts
 - Substance abuse
 - Isolation from friends
 - Physical trauma
 - Self harm and eating disorders
 - Sleep disorders
- Drop in grades or work performance
- Sexually transmitted infections (STI's)
 - And many more
